





ROYAL MANDALAY

MARCH 9, 2016 (Option One)

Amarapura, the "immortal city," is a former royal capital and home to Mahagandayon Monastery, one of the largest in Myanmar. Nearby you can cross U Bein's famous footbridge, the longest teak bridge in the world. Mandalay, the last royal capital of the Myanmar Empire, was founded by King Mindon in 1859. Visit its most sacred shrine, the Mahamuni Pagoda, where gold leaf is applied regularly to the revered Mahamuni Buddha. The Kuthodaw Pagoda houses the world's largest book, inscribed with the canon of Buddhist scripture. Climb holy Mandalay Hill for a serene view of the beautiful city below.

ANCIENT TEMPLES OF BAGAN

MARCH 9, 2016 (Option Two)

Originally founded in 849 AD, Bagan became the first capital of a unified Myanmar Empire under the reign of King Anawrahta. Home to more than 2,000 religious shrines, it is one of the richest archaeological sites in Asia and one of the architectural wonders of the world. You will be awed by the details of each monumental masterpiece. Visit the Ananda Temple, the Gubyaukgyi Temple and the Dhammayangyi Temple, the most massive in Bagan.

HANOI EXPERIENCE

MARCH 25, 2016

Immerse yourself in the culture, history and beauty of Hanoi and its surrounding areas. In addition to visiting many of Hanoi's important cultural landmarks, such as the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum, Temple of Literature, Museum of Ethnology and Old Quarter, you will also be entertained by a water puppet show, a unique Vietnamese art form created in the 11th century to amuse the kings. Visit Hoa Lo Prison, which was used to hold American soldiers during the Vietnam War, including Senator John McCain. Then enjoy ample opportunity to explore the countryside and the city's colorful side streets, getting a glimpse of everyday life.

EXCLUSIVE TOUR & LUNCH AT THE GREAT WALL OF CHINA

APRIL 6, 2016

One of the Seven Wonders of the World, the Great Wall of China is over 2,000 years old and 5,500 miles long, beginning at the Yellow Sea, crossing five provinces and ending at the Gobi Desert. Surrounded by lush greenery, enjoy a delicious lunch in an exclusive venue at the foot of an unrestored section of the wall. After lunch explore the Great Wall of Badaling, the first section of the wall opened to tourists after being restored in 1957.

ROYAL BALINESE TEMPLE FEAST


APRIL 26, 2016

The entrance is lined with royal torches and a traditional gamelan orchestra plays just for you. Adorned in traditional costumes, the villagers of Mengwi lead you to a Balinese feast and cultural experience at the Taman Ayun Temple. Dine on Indonesian fare as you are presented with a mesmerizing dance and musical performance featuring a haunting kecak chant and fire dance as well as the magical footwork and gestures of the legong dance. During this extraordinary evening, you will be treated like Balinese royalty.

1940s PATRIOTIC EVENING ABOARD THE BATTLESHIP *MISSOURI*


JUNE 7, 2016


Located on historic Battleship Row in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, a mere ship-length away from the USS *Arizona* Memorial, the USS *Missouri* is best known as the site of the end of World War II. Often referred to as "Mighty Mo," the decks of this battleship were where General Douglas MacArthur accepted the official surrender of Japan in September 1945. As the sun sets behind the Waianae mountain range, tour this hallowed vessel and enjoy hors d'oeuvres, cocktails and patriotic performances of tunes from the 1940s.

Rainbow Falls is a tropical rainforest wonder found in Hawaii State Park. The Falls derives its name from the fact that, on sunny mornings, rainbows can be seen in the mist thrown up by the waterfall. Best views come just after a heavy rain storm so the falls are running strong. The Wailuku River rushes into a large pool below the falls as the gorge is blanketed by lush, dense tropical foliage.

RANGOON, BURMA (YANGON, MYANMAR)

2 OVERNIGHTS | MARCH 8-10


HANOI (HA LONG BAY), VIETNAM
